

# ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

## PACE UNIVERSITY and the STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK AT COBLESKILL

Pace University ("PACE"), a New York State not-for-profit education corporation with its principal place of business at One Pace Plaza, New York, NY 10038, and the State University of New York at Cobleskill ("SUNY COBLESKILL") for good and valuable consideration, the exchange, receipt, and adequacy of which are hereby mutually acknowledged, do hereby covenant and agree by signature to this document (the "Agreement") to establish an Articulation Agreement for a *Dual Degree Program* (the "Program"). This Agreement will guarantee SUNY Cobleskill students in the Bachelor of Science in Communication Technology Program who meet specified criteria admission to Pace University's Master of Arts in Media and Communication Arts Program ("MAMCA"). Upon successful completion of the Program and degree requirements, such students will receive a Bachelor of Science in Communication Technology degree from SUNY COBLESKILL and a MA in Media and Communication Arts degree from PACE. Students will normally complete the Program in five years.

The academic advising, admission, transfer of credits, enrollment, and monetary conditions under this Agreement will be carried out in accordance with the following policies and procedures:

1. Initial application to the Program will be made to SUNY COBLESKILL.
2. Students enroll in this Program by declaring a major in Communication Technology at the time of admission to SUNY COBLESKILL or early enough in their study at SUNY COBLESKILL to permit them to complete the appropriate degree requirements for this program in reasonable time. (See the Appendix for the Communication Technology program).
3. Students enrolling in the Program will be considered SUNY COBLESKILL students until they complete all requirements for the SUNY COBLESKILL degree/major. Once students are admitted to PACE according to the policies of this Agreement, they also become PACE students for the remainder of the Program.
4. The Program requires 5 years of full time equivalency study. For the first three years the Host Institution for students in the Program will be SUNY COBLESKILL, and for the last two years the Host Institution will be PACE. Tuition and fees will be paid to the Host Institution according to its normal policies.
5. While students are enrolled at a Host Institution they will be independently responsible for applicable fees at the other institution on a per use basis.
6. Students in the Program will make a formal application to PACE in the fall semester of their third (junior) year (no later than December 1<sup>st</sup>) at SUNY COBLESKILL.
7. Students will matriculate at PACE once they have met the following requirements:
  - a. Completion of at least 101 credits at SUNY COBLESKILL with an overall minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 at the time of application to PACE and maintain an overall minimum GPA at the time of completion of the first three years of the Program at SUNY COBLESKILL.
  - b. Students receive a minimum grade of "C" or better on all required courses for the Bachelor of Science in Communication in Technology degree at SUNY COBLESKILL


- c. Completion of the required courses at SUNY COBLESKILL as specified in the Appendix to this Agreement
  - d. Students will meet the academic requirements for admission, including specific coursework as outlined on the attached guide sheets and complete the formal admission process for PACE
8. Students who have been admitted to PACE as part of this Program will receive a Bachelor of Science degree in Communication Technology from SUNY COBLESKILL once they have met the following requirements:
  - a. Completion of the degree requirements at SUNY COBLESKILL for this Program, and
  - b. Completion of the first year of the Master of Arts at PACE.
9. Students will complete their requirements for a Master of Arts once the prescribed requirements of the MAMCA program have been met.
10. In order to predict the correct number of student registrations, faculty advisors for PACE and SUNY COBLESKILL will annually project the number of students and course enrollments.
11. Credits earned in the Program will appear on both the PACE transcript and the SUNY COBLESKILL transcript according to the transfer credit policies of each institution.
12. Students in the Program are subject to the policies and procedures of their Host Institution. The Host Institution will have jurisdiction to suspend or terminate a student based upon its own policies and procedures, subject to written notice to the student and the other institution. The Program will be reviewed on an ongoing basis in order to modify the requirements as necessary. The Program may be altered with the prior written consent of both institutions.
13. Should either PACE or SUNY COBLESKILL wish to terminate the Program, one year advance written notice will be given; students already enrolled will be permitted to complete their programs of study.
14. Students successfully completing the Program will be eligible to participate in the commencement exercises of each institution.
15. Both PACE and SUNY COBLESKILL may publicize the Program in the appropriate publications and bulletins, subject to written pre-approval by both institutions.
16. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this Agreement, neither party shall be liable, nor shall any credit or other remedy be extended, for such party's failure, in whole or in part, to fulfill its obligations under this Agreement where such failure arises from or in connection with causes reasonably beyond such party's control, including, but not limited to, acts of God, flood, extreme weather, fire or other natural calamity, terrorist attack, any law, order, or regulation or action of any governmental entity or civil or military authority, power or utility failure, cable cuts, unavailability of rights-of-way, national emergencies, riots, wars, strikes, lock-outs, work stoppages, or other labor difficulties (each a "Force Majeure Event"). If a Force Majeure Event occurs during the term hereof, Pace shall be excused from performance hereunder for the duration of the Force Majeure Event.
17. Each party warrants on its behalf and that of its contractors, employees, and agents that at all times hereunder it shall comply with all applicable Federal, State and local laws, ordinances, rules, regulations and codes.

18. The parties agree to cooperate with each other in connection with any internal investigations by PACE or by SUNY COBLESKILL of possible violation of their respective policies and procedures and any third party litigation, except that PACE shall not be required to have any contact with any Union or Union representatives of SUNY's employees or subcontractors or participate in any Union grievance or other proceedings relative to SUNY COBLESKILL'S employees or subcontractors except as a fact witness.
19. Except as may be preempted by federal law, this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of New York, without regard to its choice of law principles. Litigation of all disputes between the parties arising from or in connection with the Agreement shall be conducted in a court of appropriate jurisdiction in the Borough of Manhattan, City of New York.
20. If a court holds any provision of this Agreement to be illegal, invalid, or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect and the parties shall amend this Agreement to give effect to the stricken clause to the maximum extent possible.


21. Failure of either party to enforce any of its rights hereunder shall not constitute a waiver of such right(s) or of any other rights and shall not be construed as a waiver or relinquishment of any such provisions, rights, or remedies; rather, the same shall remain in full force and effect.


