I. General Statement of Purpose

This document establishes a formal Memorandum of Understanding between the SUNY Cobleskill's Bachelor of Science in Early Childhood Studies, Birth to Age 5 degree program and SUNY Cortland's Master of Science in Teaching (MST), Childhood Education (Grades 1-6) graduate program.

Thus, the purpose of this document is to facilitate the admission of qualified SUNY Cobleskill Bachelor of Science in Early Childhood Studies, Birth to Age 5 degree recipients into SUNY Cortland's Master of Science in Teaching (MST), Childhood Education (Grades 1-6) graduate program.

II. Requirements and Terms

- A. Students must earn a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above at the time of application to the graduate program, and maintain an overall GPA of 3.0 or above at the time of completion and graduation with the Bachelor of Science in Early Childhood Studies, Birth to Age 5 degree program.
- B. Students will receive a minimum grade of C or better on all required courses for the Bachelor degree at SUNY Cobleskill, resulting in a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- C. Completion of the Bachelor of Science in Early Childhood Studies, Birth to Age 5 at SUNY Cobleskill is required.
- D. Students will meet the academic requirements for admission including specific coursework as outlined on the attached guide sheets.
- E. The admissions application for SUNY Cortland's Master of Science in Teaching (MST), Childhood Education graduate program must be completed.
- F. Students will provide SUNY Cortland with a final transcript listing degree posted and cumulative GPA for the Bachelor of Science in Early Childhood Studies, Birth to Age 5 program.

III. Benefits and Advantages

A. One benefit is admission to SUNY Cortland's Master of Science in Teaching (MST), Childhood Education graduate degree program, leading to initial New York State teaching certification in Childhood Education (Grades 1-6), for qualified SUNY Cobleskill students.

B. Another advantage is to attract qualified students to both institutions who wish to pursue a Master's degree leading to initial New York State teaching certification in Childhood Education (Grades 1-6).

IV. Review and Revision of this Memorandum of Understanding

Re-evaluation and renewal will be carried out by the faculty and/or staff designated as contact persons or their successors. The initial contact persons from each institution are Cynthia Benton, Ph.D., SUNY Cortland and Lisa Lopez, SUNY Cobleskill.

Should either party desire to terminate this agreement, notification will be given to the other party, in writing, not less than six months prior to the proposed date of termination.
